SAMPLE: Music

Title: Bonnie Tyler and Eclipses!

Background: This project contains two key ideas.

- a) Music often describes events in the world around us. Sometimes, these events are also described by science. Bonnie Tyler's *Total Eclipse of the Heart* is an example of this music-science link.
- b) Science frequently uses the <u>metaphor</u> to present a certain idea in a simplified way. The metaphor may look at the idea from a very <u>different</u> viewpoint than in a science textbook. But, creating a useful metaphor requires a clear understanding of the idea being explained.

Process:

- 2. Use the lyrics to help you answer the following questions.

Questions:

- 1. The song's emotional content must be analysed first to help you create your eclipse metaphor.
- a) What is her overall mental state?
- b) Two key lyrics are: "Your love is like a shadow on me all of the time; I don't know what to do and I'm always in the dark." How do these lines tie in with the song title?
- 2. Sketch a solar eclipse, showing:
- i) the source of the light
- ii) what is blocking the light
- iii) the area on which the shadow falls.
- 3. a) Name the degrees of a solar eclipse.
- b) What are the types of shadows associated with a solar eclipse?
- c) Emotionally, the lady is in which type of shadow?
- 4. Now, sketch your <u>visual metaphor</u> of a solar eclipse as it relates to the emotional nature of song. Show: i) the source of the "light"
- ii) what is blocking the "light"
- iii) the area on which the shadow falls.
